

**MINUTES OF THE CITY COUNCIL MEETING OF THE  
CITY OF NASHVILLE, ARKANSAS  
JULY 26, 2016**

The City Council of the City of Nashville met on Tuesday, July 26, 2016 at 6:00 p.m. in the City Hall Council Chamber for the regular monthly meeting.

Presiding Officer Mayor Billy Ray Jones called the meeting to order.

Jimmy Dale led the Council in prayer.

Dale Pierce led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Upon roll call, all members were present with the exception of Kay Gathright and Mike Milum. Others in attendance were Louie Graves, Brent Pinkerton, Attorney Bryan Chesshir, Chief Dale Pierce, Wendy Harris, Jimmy Dale, Larry Dunaway, Dennis Green and City Clerk Woodruff.

Monica Clark made a motion to accept the minutes and was seconded by Jimmie Lou Kirkpatrick. There were 10 yeas and 0 nays.

Jimmy Dale presented financials and explained the extraordinary expenses. He told the council that the bank has stated that the FEMA money has been deposited but that we have not gotten anything from FEMA verifying that. Jimmy said since we have no hard cover proof of the deposit from anyone that he has not posted it and therefore it was not showing on the June financial. With there being no questions Carol Mitchell made a motion to accept the financials with a second by Monica Clark. There were 10 yeas and 0 nays.

Larry Dunaway told the Council that he really had nothing new to report. Said that the city workers and the gas company have been working together to get Leslie St finished up so they could make the turn down 8<sup>th</sup> St. Larry stated that they should be done on Leslie by the end of July and finished up on 8<sup>th</sup> by the time school starts. Larry told the Council that he is still waiting on all the red tape to be finished on the sidewalk project, pump project and chlorinator project. He told the Council that we had passed our yearly Sanitary Survey with flying colors.

Wendy Harris told the council that the final check for the 2014 Recreation Grant had been received and it totaled \$23,006.00. She told the Council that after the Co-Ed tournament on July 2 the park had cleared \$1,856.00 over expenses. She asked the Council to approve a resolution for her to apply for a 2017 Outdoor 50/50 Grant. City Clerk Woodruff read Resolution 2016-07 and after some discussion and questions and some clarification from Attorney Chesshir, Monica Clark made a motion to approve the resolution with James Parker making the second. The resolution passed 10-0.



Vivian Wright seconded the motion and there were 11 yeas and 0 nays.

With there being no further business Jimmie Lou Kirkpatrick made a motion to adjourn with Kay Gathright seconding. Meeting adjourned at 6:45 p.m.

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




