

**MINUTES OF THE CITY COUNCIL MEETING OF THE  
CITY OF NASHVILLE, ARKANSAS  
AUGUST 27, 2018**

The City Council of the City of Nashville met on Monday, August 27, 2018 at 6:00 pm in the City Hall Council Chamber for the regular monthly meeting. Presiding Officer Mayor Billy Ray Jones called the meeting to order, Nick Davis led the prayer and Chief Dale Pierce led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Upon roll call 10 members were present. James Parker and Andy Anderson were absent. Others in attendance were City Clerk Woodruff, Jonathon Canady (SW Arkansas Radio) Louie Graves (Nashville Leader), Kimberly Green, Finance Director, Mark Dale, Park Director, Larry Dunaway, Public Works Director and City Attorney Aaron Brasel. Joe Hoen made a motion to approve the July minutes and Vivian Wright seconded. There were 10 yeas.

Kimberly Green explained the extraordinary expenses for July. Water purchased a Mini-Ex and split the cost between Capital Outlay and Capital Reserve Savings. The playground equipment at Toland Heights was replaced at the cost of \$38,060.00 but insurance had already paid the city. Kimberly stated that City sales tax had increased by 14% and the County had increased by 12%. With there being no questions from the council Carol Mitchell made the motion to accept the financials for July and Jimmie Lou Kirkpatrick made the second. There were 10 yeas.

Larry gave an update stating that the Phase 1 sidewalk project was completed and all paperwork had been turned in for reimbursement. He discussed with the council a sewer line that was bottleneaking and a proposed project with ANRC to fix it by running larger pipe to the manhole. Larry had no further business to discuss.

Mark Dale stated all he needed was a resolution passed for the Historic Preservation Program to make repairs to the Legion Hut. City Clerk Woodruff read 2018-07 **"A RESOLUTION TO GRANT A CONSERVATION EASEMENT TO THE ARKANSAS HISTORIC PRESERVATION PROGRAM FOR NASHVILLE AMERICAN LEGION BUILDING"** Carol Mitchell made a motion to pass the resolution and Monica Clark seconded. There were 10 yeas.

Chief Dale Pierce gave his resignation effective January 1, 2019. After some discussion about placing ads to take application the Chief was wished the best for his future.

Under new business a citizen had asked if the new foot bridge by high school could be dedicated to Elmer & Clara Davis. They used to own and run the little grocery store for years right there in the curve at Pope St. Matt Smith made a motion to dedicate the bridge and Monica Clark made the second. There were 10 yeas.

With there being no further business Joe Hoen made a motion to adjourn and Carol Mitchell made the second. Meeting adjourned at 6:29 pm
